

## WAXAHACHIE BAND BOOSTER MEETING MONDAY, MAY 4, 2009

Meeting called to order at 7 pm by Ronnie McMahan.

### MINUTES

The minutes from the April 4, 2009, were unavailable due to the unavoidable absence of Virginia Tipton.

### FINANCIAL REPORT

The financial report was delayed until later in the meeting.

### DIRECTORS REPORTS

Donnie Owens, Kendra Ray, and Dan Francis were all at Wedgeworth for a night of recruiting fifth graders for the 2009-2010 sixth grade band. We currently have 120-130 students signed up for band; however, we would like to continue to add to that number. Mr. Armstrong provided the reports for their campuses on in their absence.

#### Clift Middle School

The decision by the District regarding out-of-district travel prohibited CMS Band from competing in the second Sandy Lake Music Festival and the Beach Within Reach Festival. Instead, the band is focusing their efforts on preparations for their Spring Concert, scheduled for May 21.

Mr. Owens has been requested to apply for several awards, and Mr. Armstrong feels that there is a strong probability that this will happen due to Mr. and Mrs. Owens' consistent record keeping through scrapbooks, articles submitted, etc.

#### Finley/Howard

The District's ruling also forced the cancellation of the Finley and Howard bands to, not only Beach Within Reach Festival, but the field trip to Six Flags on Saturday as well. Their focus is now on preparations for their Spring Concert, scheduled for May 14, and their Solo and Ensemble Contest on May 30.

In addition, a mail-out is being prepared for a specified group of sixth graders, inviting them to try out for seventh grade band. Postcards will be mailed within the next week.

### WHS

Mr. Armstrong reported that, for the seventeenth straight year, all programs received straight I's at the UIL competitions, plus the bonus of CMS being named Grand Champion at the Sandy Lake Music Festival.

The Wind Ensemble is planning to travel to Richardson High School to record for Honor Band on Saturday, May 16.

Mr. Armstrong attended the Volunteer Luncheon today and was extremely proud of the awards announced for the various bands, not to mention the number of volunteers and hours for the past school year.

The report from the Percussion Concert on Saturday was that it was very impressive, and some of the numbers may be repeated at the WHS Spring Concert.

Several WHS band students are participating in various areas of the musical, "Anything Goes" this weekend, and everyone is urged to come and support their efforts.

Approximately 35-36 WHS band students will be playing for the Grand Opening of the new theater on Broadhead Road on May 14<sup>th</sup>. Chuck Norris will be the special guest, with participating students receiving discounts on concessions and the opportunity to view a free movie.

Upcoming events include the Alumni Concert on May 16, the WHS Spring Concert on the 19<sup>th</sup>, the 2009 Freshmen special practice with the Wind Ensemble, and the State Solo and Ensemble Contest on May 30,

Mr. Armstrong expressed appreciation for the opportunity to work with the quality of students in the WHS Band Program.
