**WOW!** The Finley and Howard Bands prove the tradition of receiving straight "I's" - **SWEEPSTAKES** - is not only alive and well, but will continue for several years into the future!

Both bands have accomplished a great deal, and we were looking forward to further competition at Beach Within Reach Festival, followed by a trip to Siz Flags. Upon returning next week, we will concentrate our efforts on preparing for our Spring Concert scheduled for May 18, and our Solo and Ensemble Contest May 22nd.

It's difficult to realize that we have less than a month of school, but the Finley and Howard Bands will be hard at work as we make sure to end the year on a high note!

As August 2009 approached, we anticipated an outstanding year for the Clift Middle School Band, but we had no idea just exactly how great this banner year would be! It has been filled with successful fund raising activities - a garage sale, Express Industries, World's Finest Chocolate (realizing a net sale of \$12,000.00) and the Jazz Café/Silent Auction (where the CMS band students' products were some of the best!); a "fun" trip to Celebration Station, a Holiday Season Concert that earned two standing ovations, and a solo and ensemble contest earning five One ++ ratings, 52 Division One + ratings, 140 Division One ratings and 28 Division Two ratings.

For the sixth consecutive year at the Pre-Sandy Lake Performance, Clift received Division One and One Plus ratings from five reputable judges in the categories of: Stage Presence, Warm-up, Concert Performance (three numbers) and Sight Reading. As one of the judges said, "These children know their fundamentals well, or they would not be able to perform the Junior High Second Band (non-varsity) music at a Division One and One Plus level."

Then, the "big day" finally arrived - Friday, April 23, with the band earning its seventh consecutive "Outstanding Band of the Contest" award, receiving ratings of 1+, 1+ and 1 from judges Don Hanna (retired Band Director of Hardin-Simmons University and member of the Texas Bandmasters Hall of Fame), Travis Almany (Associate Director of Texas A & M Bands/College Station), and Dr. Gary Barrow (Associate Professor of Music, Arkansas Tech University, Russellville, Arkansas). And, please, one moment for a little bragging - the judges comments included - "Great fundamentals - embouchures, air support, posture, hand positions, etc."; "Good precision, balance, matched articulations and note lengths"; "Wonderful ensemble and individual sounds. Terrific musicality!!"; "Great style, dynamics, crisp staccatos and smooth slurs"; "Very exciting playing. What wonderful sounds you make, and you perform with great stylistic treatment"; "This was a terrific rendition of 'Espana Cani'. Great solo playing - Great tone quality"; "Your performance level is astonishing and a real joy to hear -

Bravo!"; "Balance and blend are obviously an important part of your rehearsals; that effort brings a good deal of maturity to your sound"; "All of the basics, including posture, hand positions and embouchures seem to be in place; Clift musicians are off to a good start"; "The start of 'Aribian Dances' is a special musical moment"; "I appreciate both the tone quality and tuning. You not only met, but exceeded my expectations."

Now, we are down to three performances for the 2009-2010 CMS band: another appearance at the Sandy Lake Music Festival on Saturday, May 1, Beach Within Reach Festival on Friday, May 7, and our Spring Concert on May 19. We anticipate continuing our tradition of winning at both Sandy Lake and Beach Within Reach, where CMS bands have been awarded the "Most Outstanding Band" every year, and "Grand Champion" of the entire contest for two consecutive years prior to a rule change eliminating beginning bands from competition with seventh and eighth grade non-varsity groups.

As we wrap up this year and take a quick look back, we are so privileged to have been associated with some wonderful WISD band students. Over the past eight years, the Turner/Clift Bands have been awarded "Most Outstanding Band" in more than 300 entries in the Metroplex, Oklahoma and Arkansas - not bad for a beginning band program that starts each year with "squeaks and squawks"! It would be an understatement to say that we are extremely proud of all the students who have passed through the Turner/Clift Band program. What an honor for every student who began their band experience at Turner/Clift to be able to include on their resume the fact that they participated in "The Most Outstanding Band" at the Sandy Lake Band Festival, Beach Within Reach or Festival in the Sticks. Each and every Waxahachie bandsman has added to our lives, and we trust that we have, in turn, contributed something positive to their WISD experience. We wish each of them the best as we all move forward to the next chapter...
